## USING MENU MODULE

### USING CUSTOM CSS TO OVERRIDE THE COLLAPSED MENU DISPLAY

This code:

```
{HTML()} <style> .mysitemap .cssmenu_vert li ul { display: block !important; position: static !important; } </style> {HTML}  
{module module="menu" id="43" bootstrap="n" class="mysitemap" setSelected="n" title="Sitemap"}
```

## 1.1.2. USING TOC FROM A STRUCTURE

If you use a menu from a structure of wiki pages, you can use

{toc}
```

to produce the table of contents of that site.
